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person," Bodine said.

"Spiritually and emotionally they provide each other with a lot of love," Bishop Clark said of the teens and people who encourage them. "When you try to be with people, you receive so much more than you give. They are always there for you. There is something about communication, constancy and loyalty that is beautiful.'

Bishop Clark said he participated in the forum "to learn and find out about the wisdom of God and his people -- which are you," he explained, gesturing to the audience. "I want to learn from you, to be inspired by you and to be encouraged by you."

"I think the perspective they (teens) bring to the church is significantly different from the perspective I brought at their age.

you get to meet a lot of different people. You get to learn about them and yourself.

These kids have the gift of the Spirit and have the wisdom of the church," Bishop Clark said. "I think the church isn't as responsive to their needs as it should be. It's always a dialogic thing," Bishop Clark said, adding that forums like this one help bridge the gap of understanding.

One hundred and forty-four graduating seniors from around the diocese "who have lived a Christian life at school, home, in their neighborhood and in their parish" were honored with the Hands of Christ Recognition Award.

The students attended workshops on such topics as suicide and college life. Bishop Clark also celebrated Mass.

Young adults, aged 18-35, also attended the day. They participated in a separate set of workshops, and also attended Mass with the teenagers.
