Thriller lacks luster; 'Cry-Baby' satirizes '50s rebels

NEW YORK — A lackluster Cold War thriller, "The Fourth War" (Cannon) illustrates how two off-kilter colonels — one American and one Soviet — do personal battle on the Czechoslovak-West German border circa 1988.

This pointless effort, based on a novel by Stephen Peters, who co-wrote the screenplay, was directed by John Frankenheimer ("The Manchurian Candidate") as if the protagonists deserve our attention and concern. They don't.

Basically, Col. Jack Knowles (Roy Scheider) and Col. Valachev (Jurgen Prochnow) are has-been officers in search of a battlefield. With no more wars to fight, they attempt to start one on their own. Vietnam vet Knowles causes problems wherever he's stationed, to the consternation of his mentor and protector, Gen. Hackworth (Harry Dean Stanton as an offbeat choice for this role).

After he witnesses the merciless murder of a Czech defector. Knowles instantly begins to harass the Soviet guards by slipping over the border half-soused, tinkering with their radar equipment and finally burning down their watchtower. This malicious mischief is so senseless and infantile that Knowles loses all credibility as a character and movie hero at this point.

When his incendiary actions are addressed by his Soviet counterpart, Knowles is so oblivious to the insanity of his actions that he agrees to help an exiled Czech woman (Lara Harris in a bad Ingrid Bergman imitation) slip over the border to retrieve her small daughter. This bit of intrigue is ludicrously suspenseless.

In the end, Knowles and Valachev battle it out one-on-one knee-deep in the snowand ice-covered strip of land separating

West Germany and Czechoslovakia. Meanwhile, their respective troops zero in with loaded tanks, helicopters and sophisticated weaponry. When the bloodsoaked, frosty duo find their fists useless, they face off with snowballs at final fade.

The title of the film apparently reflects Albert Einstein's prophecy that although the third world war may be fought with nuclear weapons, the fourth will be fought with stones. This is a jolting prognostication. Stanley Kubrick ("2001: A Space Odyssey"), where are you when we need you?

Due to some profanity and pointless, grisly climactic violence, the U.S. Catholic Conference classification is A-III — adults. The Motion Picture Association of America rating is R — restricted.

'Cry-Baby'

Fresh from the success of his 1988 hit "Hairspray," writer-director John Waters has concocted another offbeat musical bonbon with "Cry-Baby" (Universal), a film for those leather-coated, pompadoured juvenile delinquents who held court on U.S. soil circa 1954.

Again partial to his home turf, the onetime king of camp satirically zeroes in on the two teenage factions, the "drapes" and the "squares," at large in Baltimore during those heady pre-rock rockabilly

Sparks fly when Wade "Cry-Baby" Walker (Johnny Depp), a "drape" gang leader from the wrong side of the tracks, falls hard for Allison Vernon-Williams (Amy Locane), a beautiful, rich "square" who is tired of being a good girl. Handsome, sensitive Wade is nicknamed Cry-Baby because his father fried in "the Chair."

Wade drops one single tear every time he's hurt or sad. He hot rods around town

with his leather-clad drapes and drapettes and lives with his sleazy grandmother, Ramona Rickettes (Susan Tyrrell, who looks like a "Li'l Abner" reject), and her musical beau, Belvedere (Iggy Pop).

Allison is just about suffocated by her crinolines, very proper grandmother (Polly Bergen) and smug, buttoned down, crewcut beau, Baldwin (Stephen Mailer, son of Norman). During class polio vaccination day, she and Cry-Baby catch each other's eye and the rest is history.

Waters does a great job of satirizing the innocence of mid-'50s, teenage rebellion and the problems of conformity, especially as depicted in movies of the period. Several of the 11 musical production numbers choreographed by Lori Eastside are show-stoppers, especially those set in a boys' reform school.

Although Depp and the talented Locane ("Lost Angels") will attract adolescent attention to this film (Depp is already a teen idol for his work on television's "21 Jump Street"), "Cry-Baby" is directed primarily at baby boomers and pre-baby boomers who survived as teen and pre-teen rebels or conformists during this gloriously innocent
