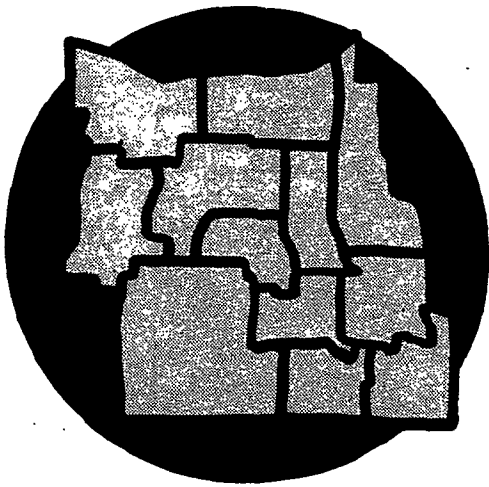
**Prattsburg church plans June 3 visitation program**
