# School initiates grouping for community spirit

#### Mercy student attends leadership seminar

ROCHESTER — Megan Clifford, a student at Our Lady of Mercy High School, was recently chosen to represent New York state at the Hugh O'Brien Youth Foundation Leadership Seminar in St. Paul, Minn.

The HOBY program, which took place July 21-28, drew 250 students from each of the 50 states and 28 foreign countries. Clifford had originally been chosen to represent Mercy at the western New York state HOBY seminar earlier this year.

Established in 1958 by actor Hugh O'Brien, the seminar's purpose is to identify, recognize and reward leadership potential in high school sophomores. The theme of this year's conference was "The Role of the United States in the World Community."
