Father Hauser appointed to Wadhams Hall faculty

Father Albert J. Hauser, a graduate of Ss. Peter and Paul School and McQuaid Jesuit High School in Rochester, was recently appointed to the faculty of Wadhams Hall in Ogdensburg.



The appointment was made by Father Thomas J. Thottumkal, president and rector of Wadhams Hall.

A native of Rochester, Father Hauser received his undergraduate degree in mathematics from LeMoyné College in Syracuse. After completing his theological studies at Christ the King Seminary in East Aurora, N.Y., he was ordained a priest of the Ogdensburg diocese in 1981. He received his master of arts degree in theology in 1983.

This past June, Father Hauser received his license in theology in biblical theology from the Gregorian University and Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome.

Among his pastoral experiences, Father Hauser served as parochial vicar of St. Patrick's Church in Watertown and Notre Dame Church in Ogdensburg. In March of 1983, he was appointed assistant chancellor of the Ogdensburg diocese and in September of the same year he became secretary to Bishop Stanislaus J. Brzana. He served in these two positions until the fall of 1988.

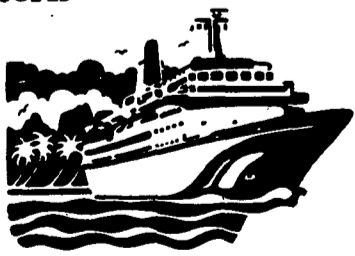
