Volunteers are needed to help provide transportation for the home-bound. Firstand second-graders are invited to participate in the procession at the closing Mass on Oct. 11.



House of Mercy slated to celebrate 5th year of operating with weeklong series of events

ROCHESTER — A weeklong series of events beginning Sept. 30 will mark the fifth anniversary of the founding of the House of Mercy, 102 Central Park.

An outreach center providing free dropin services to neighborhood residents, the House of Mercy was founded Oct. 1, 1985 by Sister Grace Miller, RSM. The center serves approximately 1,500 people each month, according to staff member Sister Barbara DiFiore, RSM.

The week of celebration will begin with an ecumenical service on Sunday, Sept. 30, at 2 p.m. The featured speaker at the service will be Father Sebastian Falcone, president of St. Bernard's Institute.

A liturgy at 2 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 7, will mark the end of the celebration. Father William Onuh of Nigeria will be the main celebrant and homilist. Both events will take place outside of the House of Mercy and will be followed by public receptions.

In addition to the two services, open houses are scheduled for 1-4 p.m., Monday through Friday. "Gospel Night," featuring several Rochester-area gospel choirs, will take place on Friday, Oct. 5, from 7-9 p.m.

The center helps clients with such emergency needs as food, clothing, bedding and furniture. Staff members also assist clients with long-term needs in such areas as housing, health care, employment and education. Clients may also receive help in applying for public assistance, Social Security or veterans' benefits.

Sister Miller, RSM, a Corning native, worked alone at the House of Mercy for the first year and a half. Since then, she has been joined by Eli Danzy Jr. and two other Sisters of Mercy, Sister Rita Lewis and Sister DiFiore.

The outreach center has also received much help from neighborhood volunteers. About 20 men and women make up the volunteer staff today. During the past year, workers have focused their attention on the education needs of adult clients.
