



**Rosary Society celebrates 125th with Mass, banquet**

GENEVA — The Rosary Society of St. Francis de Sales Parish celebrated its 125th anniversary with a Mass and banquet Oct. 1.

The main celebrant for the Mass was Father Ronald Harley, pastor. He was assisted by Monsignor Gerard Krieg, pastor of St. Stephen's Parish, and Father William Leone, former pastor of St. Francis de Sales and currently pastor of the Northern Cayuga Cluster.

Approximately 165 people attended the dinner, including Nelli Marsh, who was recognized as the oldest active member of the society. Marsh, 91, joined the Rosary Society 65 years ago.

At the dinner, former president Anna DeJohn presented a history of the society, which began in the mid-1800s as the Rosary and Altar Society. According to organizers of the event, the organization — named the Rosary Society since 1865 — is the oldest such society in the Rochester diocese.

Current membership of the Rosary Society is 200.
