Matt, defenseman Rob Armbruster, forward Mike Sawyer and his brother Eric (forward/defenseman) and forward Derek Sylvester.

Sophomores Ron Lamendola, Jeff Ozminkowski and Bobby Taylor are the Knights' returning goalies. Newcomers include Fairport transfer Brandon Wiggins, Farnco Barri, Joey Gionta, Geoff Kufta, Eric Mace, John McConville, Greg Mulbury, Rick Rambaldo, Zach Wagner and Steve Sawyer.

"You have to look at more than the work a young person does before you classify that they don't have faith," she said.

Deimel agreed with Tackney that most young people have faith but they express it in their own way. Although she didn't have too many Catholic friends in her public high school, she said that her friends had their own way of expressing their beliefs.

"Some kids drink and do drugs, but it doesn't mean they don't have faith. They are going to do these things even if they have faith, believe it or not," she commented.

Although Deimel and Foughner both said they are active in their parishes

because of their parents' influence, Tackney said that she often is the one to get her family involved in church activities. For instance, she got her father interested in the local Knights of Columbus council by introducing him to the grand knight.

"I invite my parents to come join in my activities so that they can experience what I am doing. It also helps to build trust," she said.

During the question-and-answer segment of the workshop, a youth minister stumped the panel when he asked the question, "If you could look Jesus straight in the eye and ask him one question, what would it be?"

After a few moments, Deimel was the only one to speak.

"I think I'd ask him why he died for us," she said.

"The Gulf crisis should be solved through an international conference on global peace in the Middle East. The Gulf crisis is a consequence of these other problems, which have remained unsolved," he said.

"We must apply the same international laws to all situations in the Middle East," he said.

Regarding Israeli-occupied territories, he said there should be "two separate countries, one Palestinian and one Israeli."

"We must put an end to hate. We must live in peace. This is the just solution," he said.

Currently, "Palestinians are discriminated against and persecuted in their own land," he added.

Archbishop Capucci was expelled from Israel in 1977 on condition that he not return. He has since lived in Rome. At the time of his arrest, the archbishop was Melkite patriarchal vicar for Jerusalem.

The Vatican has said that Archbishop Capucci did not go to Iraq on behalf of the Vatican. The archbishop was part of a private Italian delegation seeking the release of all Italian hostages. The release of the 70 left about 200 Italians in Iraq.

In 1979, the Vatican sent him as an envoy to Iran to ease church-state problems after the fundamentalist Islamic revolution.
