

# Padre Pio prayer group set to begin meeting in Auburn

AUBURN — A newly formed prayer group in honor of Padre Pio will begin meeting at St. Francis of Assisi Church, 185 Clark St., on Sunday, March 3, at 7 p.m.

The first meeting will consist of a Mass, followed by the parish's regular rosary session at 8 p.m. and then a social hour.

The prayer group's subsequent meetings will take place the first Sunday of every month. Each meeting will vary in format, and will sometimes include a Mass, Benediction or other forms of prayer.

According to leader Mike Rosa, the group will also sponsor a variety of events in the future, including dinners, dances and concerts. The group's coordinator is also seeking spiritual books, periodicals, tapes and videotapes to create a library for the organization.

The prayer group is dedicated to the memory of Padre Pio, an Italian Franciscan priest who, from Sept. 20, 1918, until his death on Sept. 23, 1968, reportedly experienced the stigmata — the appearance of wounds on a person's body that correspond to those suffered by Christ.
