Despite the injuries, Herbst said the pitching of Clare Stortini, Sara Bierley and Wesley should make the Little Irish competitive.

Katie Wright will split catching duties with Boprey, and infielders include Stacey Pullinzi (first base), Patti Held and Stephanie Renica (second base), Jesse LeBanc and Marcia Kress (infielders) and Sheila Maloney (shortstop).

Outfielders include Nina Cimino (center field), Sandy Petty (designated hitter), Nancy Piotrowski (right field) and exchange student Antje Gaverizak (outfield).

Herbst has brought some new coaching techniques to AQ this spring — on and off the softball diamond. For instance, he is stressing the importance of discipline by issuing a curfew for his players during the week.

The Little Irish (0-2) lost their first game to Greece Athena, 12-1, on April 8 and succumbed again to Wilson, 12-11, on April 10. The weather sent AQ's April 10 game against Penfield to the showers. The non-league game was rescheduled for May 4.

According to third-year coach Mike Baxter, Our Lady of Mercy is struggling with injuries and inexperience this spring.

In fact, five players are gone from last year's squad — Elizabeth Kowal (left field), Kristin White (right field), Nikki Lebel (third base), Kim Caccamise (shortstop) and Tracy Tegg (center field).

Only five girls return this year — Mary Beth Cleary (first base), Julie Sasso (second base), Ellen Lennox (shortstop), Gina Faggiano (catcher) and Brenda Seitz (pitcher).

Faggiano, the team's leading hitter last year (.388), will miss at least three weeks due to a shoulder injury.

Baxter said he is counting on strong defensive play and potent hitting from Lennox and Cleary, both .300-plus hitters last year.

So far, the Monarchs (1-5) have lost to Olympia, 11-10, on April 4; fell to Brighton, 20-6, on April 6; suffered another setback against Penfield, 6-1, on April 8; thrashed Marshall, 13-1, on April 9; took a beating from Bishop Kearney, 19-1, on April 11; and lost to Pittsford-

Krista DeVaney (pitcher/shortstop) and Sharon Griffa (first base) will miss the season due to knee injuries. DeSales will also miss Jeaneane Donahue and Sarah Peters. Donahue graduated and Peters transferred to Waterloo High School.

Coach Corky DeYulio, who is back at the helm of DeSales softball after leaving the position in 1986, said he is counting on senior pitcher Danielle Boncaro and senior catcher Megan Jenkins to carry the Saints this season.

This year's starters include Sharon Rose (first base), Michelle Liberatore (second base), Sarah Cataline (shortstop), Karen Campbell (third base), Lindsay Higgins and Emily Parshall (left field), Cecilia McCann (center field) and Gillian Barnard (right field).

DeYulio said the team is strong up the middle with an experienced catcher, pitcher and center fielder.

The Saints (1-1) lost their first game to Romulus, 6-0, on April 8, before trouncing Bloomfield, 25-6, on April 12.

Nazareth tabs coach for women's soccer

ROCHESTER — Charles Salamone was recently named head coach of the Nazareth College women's soccer team, according to the school's Sports Information Office.



The former women's soccer coach at Monroe Community College replaces Ron Bartlett.

A native of Brighton and a resident of Fairport, Salamone guided MCC to a remarkable 152-22-4 record and four national titles over 10 seasons. He also coached 21 junior college All-Americans at the school.

After starting the women's soccer program at MCC in 1980, Salamone coached his teams to national titles in 1982, 1985, 1986 and 1989. He was named Coach of the Year by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America in 1982.

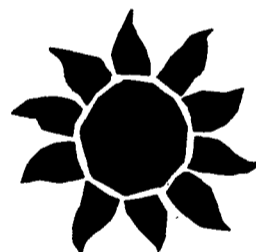
