DeSales' streak continues; ND drops three

Although Geneva DeSales is still riding the wave of success after posting its 47th consecutive victory last week, other diocesan high school boys' baseball teams are finding the road a little rockier this spring.

DeSales (8-0 in the Finger Lakes West, 9-0 overall) made it 47 and counting when the Saints crushed host Romulus, 10-1, in a league contest on May 3.

Winning pitcher Joe Vedora (3-0) struck out seven and walked none in the win.

Romulus pitcher Matt Nearpass struck out the first five DeSales batters he faced before a walk, a single and an error led to two runs for the Saints in the second inning.

The Warriors committed seven errors in the game, as only two of DeSales 10 runs were earned. Frank Pane Jr. collected four hits, including a two-run single for De-Sales. Chris Lamson had a single and a double.

On May 1, the Saints clobbered host Dundee, 7-1, in a Finger Lakes West game.

The Crusaders plated four runs on nine hits, compared to West's six runs on eight hits


Bryan Woodworth iced a two-run homer in the fifth inning and Rick Shaw went a perfect 3-for-3 for Notre Dame.
