Robert Mason, personnel director, at 55

FAIRPORT — Robert W. Mason, director of the Diocesan Division of Personnel since February, 1989, died of a massive coronary at his home Tuesday evening, May 7.

Born in Rochester on June 11, 1935, to Walter Mason and Bernadine Herbst Mason, Mr. Mason attended St. Boniface School and Aquinas Institute, both in Rochester. He obtained a bachelor's degree in English from the State University of New York at Brockport in 1958, the same year he married Barbara Donlon of Rochester.

Mr. Mason taught' intermediate classes in the East Irondequoit Elementary School System from 1958-69, where he also served as assistant to the superintendent. In the 1970s and up until the mid-1980s, he worked in the Fairport School District as director of Personnel/Collective Bargaining.


Sister Margaret Joseph's last teaching assignment was at Nazareth Hall before she retired to the sisters' motherhouse in 1977. She moved to the St. Joseph Convent Infirmary in 1980 because of failing health.

Sister Margaret Joseph is survived by two sisters, Catherine Nicholas and Helen Peer; as well as nieces and nephews. took a position with Lifetime Assistance, Inc., of Rochester, where he served as personnel administrator. The company places handicapped children in sheltered workshops and day-care centers.

A parishioner at Church of the Assumption in Fairport, Mr. Mason started the parish's Catholic Youth Organization basketball program in 1977, and also served on parish council. He also played Santa Claus at area schools and served in many volunteer capacities, according to family members.

Mr. Mason was survived by his wife, Barbara; four children, Timothy (and wife, Lorie Iuppa), Christopher and Laurie, all of Rochester, and Lisa Sauer of Elmira Heights; his brother Gerard; his sister Bernadette Derleth, of Rochester; a grandson; nieces and nephews.

Sister Esther Mary Helfer, SSND, elementary school teacher, at 81

WILTON, CONN. – Sister Esther Mary Helfer, SSND, formerly known as Sister Mary Walburga, died on April 9 in the School Sisters of Notre Dame Lourdes Health Care Center in Wilton, Conn. She was 81.

Born in Rochester on Jan. 1, 1910, and a former parishioner of St. Joseph's parish, Sister Esther Mary became a professed member of the School Sisters of Notre Dame in 1932. Throughout her career, she served as an elementary school teacher, religious superior and community leader.

Sister Esther Mary began teaching in 1927 in Baltimore and taught in Maryland schools for 17 years before moving to Rochester's St. Boniface School, where she taught from 1944-1959. She then went on to teach at schools in New Jersey, New York and Massachusetts before returning to St. Boniface for a second teaching term from 1973-1984.
