

Bishop to ordain monk at Tier monastery

PINE CITY — Bishop Matthew H. Clark will ordain Brother Nathan J. Munsch, OSB, as a priest for Mt. Saviour Monastery on Saturday, June 29. The ordination Mass will take place in the monastery chapel at 10 a.m.



Father Mar. J. Boler, OSB, prior of Mt. Saviour, Bishop William Connare of Greensburg, Pa., and the priests of the monastery will concelebrate the Mass.

The son of Thomas J. and Margaret (McKeon) Munsch, Brother Munsch was born in Pittsburgh, Pa., where he attended All Saints and St. Bonaventure elementary schools. One of nine children, he graduated from North Catholic High School in 1969.

Brother Munsch graduated with a bache-

lor's degree in history from the University of Notre Dame in 1973. He later earned a master's degree in classical languages from Duquesne University in 1976.

After teaching high school in the Pittsburgh area for several years, Brother Munsch entered Mt. Saviour Benedictine Monastery near Elmira in 1980, making his solemn profession as a monk in 1986.

In the 11 years he has lived at the monastery, the monk has served as cook, librarian, wood cutter, sacristan, translator and novice master. Brother Munsch, who was ordained a transitional deacon in the summer of 1990, has studied theology at Catholic University in Washington, D.C., for the past three years. He also recently earned his master's degree in theology.

Brother Munsch will celebrate his first Mass at the monastery on Sunday, June 30, at 9 a.m. On Sunday, July 7, he will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at his home parish of St. Bonaventure in Glenshaw, Pa.

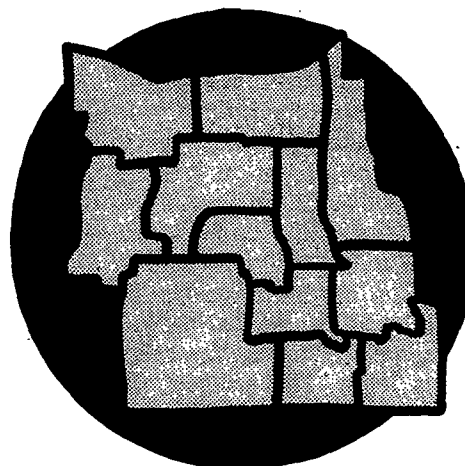
★ **Ron Gerould**, who was recently named purchasing manager at St. Joseph's Hospital.
