St. Ignatius Loyola Parish celebrating 60th jubilee

HORNELL — St. Ignatius Loyola Church is celebrating its 60th jubilee this year.

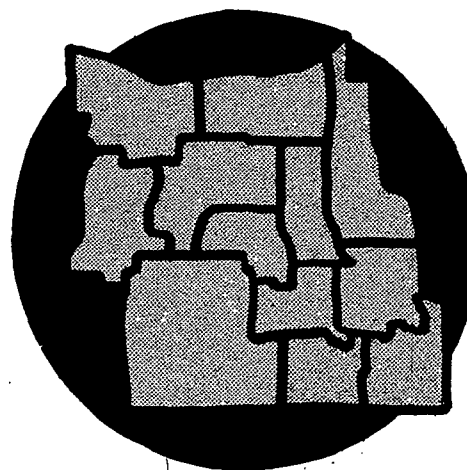
Father Ignatius X. Cameron was the first pastor of the Hornell church, which was founded on July 24, 1931. The current church building, located at the corner of Grand and West Pine Streets, was dedicated by Archbishop Edward F. Mooney on Sept. 17, 1935.

Father Cameron served as pastor of St. Ignatius until 1950. His pastorate was followed by Father Joseph McDonnell, 1950-56; Father Joseph Haffey, 1956-72; Father Leo Mans, 1972-83; and the current pastor, Father Jeremiah Moynihan.

The parish community has planned several activities as part of its jubilee celebration. A "captain and crew" golf tournament will take place at Twin Hickory Golf Club on July 14; a dinner dance is scheduled for the Knights of Columbus hall on Aug. 3; Bishop Matthew H. Clark will celebrate a Jubilee Eucharist at the church on Aug. 4; Sister Mary Lou Heffernan will conduct a retreat Oct. 20-26; and a special Jubilee Eucharist for the children of the parish will take place on Nov. 24.

Additional events are still being planned. In addition, the Jubilee Committee is making a video of the yearlong celebration. Copies of the video will be available for purchase.

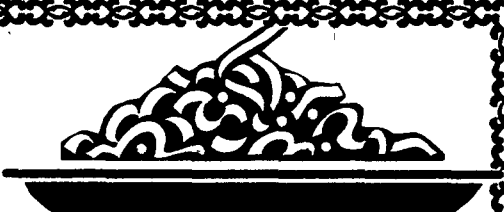
