★ **Jeanne Yax**, a junior at Nazareth Academy, who received the annual Bausch & Lomb Science Award on May 29 at the all-girls' school on Lake Avenue. The award recognizes high school juniors who have attained the highest scholastic standing in science projects. The Greece student is now eligible to become a University of Rochester Bausch & Lomb Scholar, which provides students with \$5,000 per year for four years.

★ **Gail Wyse**, a senior at St. John Fisher College, who won the 1991 Judy Weis Achievement Award, given in honor of Western New York's first congresswoman. The award annually recognizes outstanding college women in Monroe County who show leadership, concern for the community, and voluntary involvement in public service.

- Corpus Christi Center, which provides health, dental, counseling and after-school care and a high school equivalency program for adults;

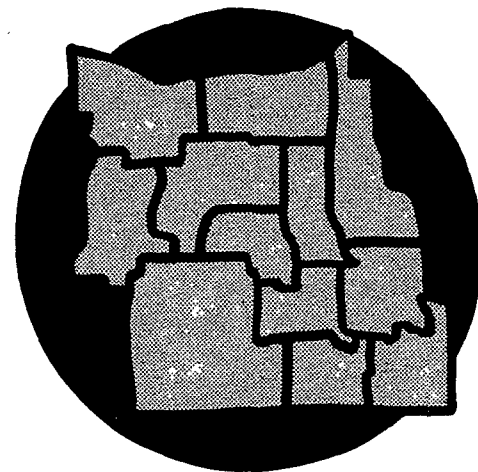
- Corpus Christi Child Care, which offers child care for children ages eight weeks to 10 years;

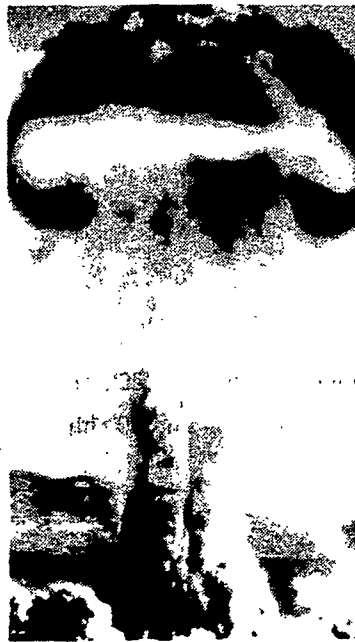
