Scottsville church plans program on Catholic faith

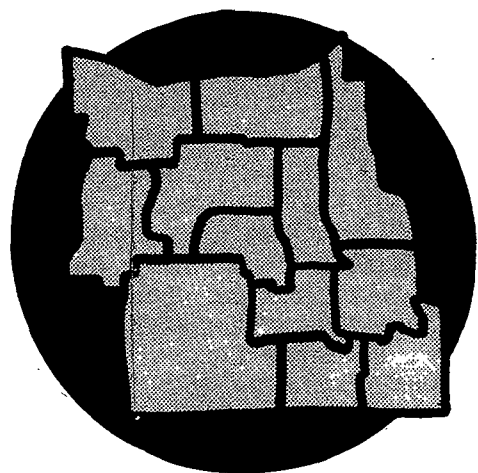

Parish to present reception for new pastor

SODUS — The Parish Activity Society of the Church of the Epiphany, 105 W. Main St., will host a reception to honor its new pastor, Father George Heyman, on Sunday, Sept. 8 in the Father Cavanaugh Parish Center from 3-5 p.m. A graduate of St. John Fisher College and St. Bernard's Seminary, Father Heyman served for one year as deacon intern at St. Ambrose Church, Rochester, and was ordained there by Bishop Matthew H. Clark on April 24, 1981. He served his priest internship at St. Mary's in Corning for one year before completing his last two years of internship at St. Pius X Church, Chili, in June, 1984. The following year he served as parochial vicar at Blessed Sacrament Church, Rochester. In June, 1985, he became parochial vicar at Church of the Assumption, Fairport. In 1987, Father Heyman began teaching as an associate member of the Ba-

silian Fathers. The new pastor in Sodus began a year of sabbatical assistance ministry in July, 1991. His first appointment during that ministry was as temporary administrator of St. John the Evangelist, Newark Valley, and St. Francis of Assisi Church, Cata-tonk. Father Heyman served in the Southern Tier until January, 1991, when he became temporary administrator of St. Anne's Church, Palmyra, and St. Gregory's Church, Marion. Father Heyman was appointed on May 1, 1991, as pastor of the Church of the Epiphany, Sodus, and its mission church, St. Rose of Lima Church, Sodus Point. After attending a language institute to learn Spanish this summer, he assumed his pastoral duties at the churches on Aug. 3. The public is welcome to attend the reception in honor of Father Heyman in the parish center.
