

Parish slates celebration for dedication anniversary

ONTARIO - St. Mary's of the Lake Parish has planned a two-part celebration marking the 25th anniversary of the dedication of the current church building.

The 142-year-old parish will begin its celebration Sunday, Sept. 22, at 3 p.m. The gala will involve the installation and dedication of a new statue of the Madonna and Child in an outdoor shrine. A chicken barbecue will follow, featuring lots of games, entertainment and square dancing.

The barbecue will begin at 4 p.m followed by square dancing at 6:30 p.m. Cost is \$6 per person, with a maximum charge of \$30 per family. Tickets for the barbecue are available after Masses.

The second part of the celebration will take place on Nov. 6 — the day marking the 25th anniversary of the church's dedication - with a 7 p.m. Mass. Many former pastors and associates from the parish will attend the Mass. Father William Gaynor, who was pastor when the church was dedicated in 1966, will celebrate the Mass.


A reception in the parish center will follow the Mass.
