'Hair-raising' show benefits food bank

ELMIRA — The Southern Tier Community Food Bank raised nearly \$500 during a "Hair Show With Fashions" at Brennan's Restaurant on Oct. 19.

The money will be used to help defray costs in transporting U.S. government surplus food to the food bank, 175 Grand Central Ave., Elmira Heights. The food was originally going to be shipped to U.S. troops serving in the Persian Gulf.

According to Irene Johnson, associate director of the food bank, about 154,000 pounds of "Desert Share Food" had

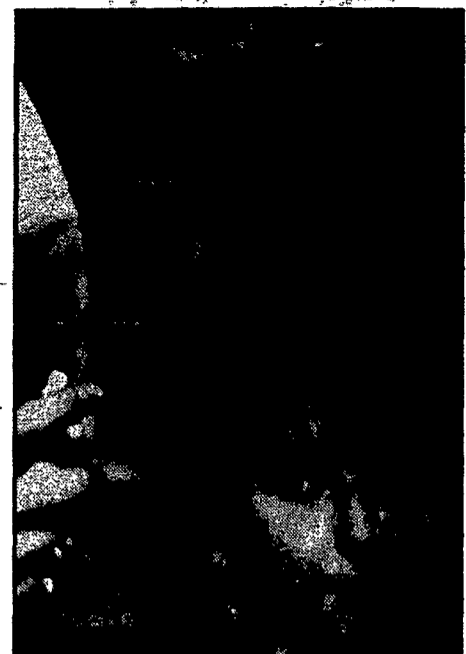
been delivered through the Second Harvest Food Bank Network as of Oct. 29. The network supplies the nation's 200 food banks with 200 millions pounds of food each year, Johnson said.

Approximately 50 people turned out for the fundraiser at Brennan's. Jim Devens of New Dimensions, an area hair design center, helped coordinate the event. The Cameo Shop and The Fashion Depot provided fashions and models for the benefit.

"We felt it went extremely well, con-

sidering the time we had to plan everything. We did this in a matter of two weeks," said Johnson, who served as director of the food bank for six years. "Jim said he was willing to do the hair show and close his shop down for one day. He's wanted to help us for some time."

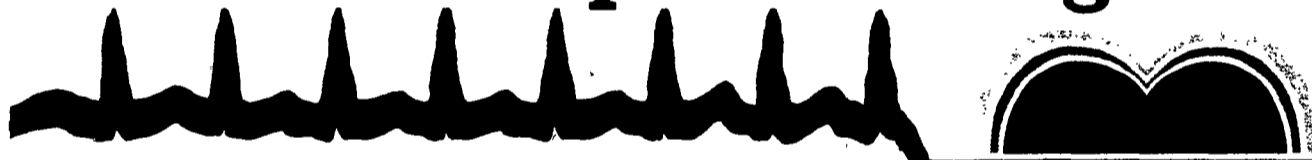
Johnson said that plans are already underway for another hair show. "We want to plan one with a little more time," Johnson said. "We'd like to include men's fashions next time."
