Hunger Awareness Fair set for St. Mary's in Rochester

ROCHESTER — Sister Marie Brown, co-director of St. Martin's Place, a soup kitchen run by Mt. Carmel Parish, will serve as the guest homilist at St. Mary's Parish, 15 St. Mary's Place, the weekend of Nov. 9-10.

The parish invited Sister Brown to participate in its Hunger Awareness Fair, which will focus on the growing numbers of women in poverty as well as many aspects of hunger in both the United States and abroad.

The conference will also include many tables and booths, featuring information on Bread for the World's "Harvest for Peace Campaign," an electronic quiz board on some of the myths about hunger; a UNICEF video on children's hunger; and a machine that can measure body fat. Guide sheets will be available to encourage people to fast on Nov. 20, the Thursday before Thanksgiving Day.
