
Knights present bishop with Quincentenary Cross

ROCHESTER — The Knights of Columbus presented the Quincentenary Cross to Bishop Matthew H. Clark on the Feast of Christ the King (Nov. 24) during the 11:30 a.m. liturgy at Sacred Heart Cathedral, 296 Flower City Park.

Arthur J. Harris, chairman of the Rochester Board of District Deputies for the Rochester diocese, made the presentation to Bishop Clark. The cross represents the evangelization begun in this hemisphere under the symbol of the cross. It is a replica of the cross planted in Santo Domingo, where this hemisphere's first cathedral was built in 1514.


The Cross of Evangelization for the observance of the fifth centenary was presented by the Holy Father to each of the Episcopal Conferences of the Americas during his visit to Santo Domingo on Oct. 12, 1984, when he initiated a nine-year novena of preparation for the Quincentenary.

The Knights of Columbus have provided funding to duplicate this cross for presentation to each diocese in the United States. The cross will appear at major celebrations throughout the Rochester diocese.

Whenever possible, the cross will accompany Bishop Clark, Bishop Dennis W. Hickey and Bishop Joseph L. Hogan when they celebrate parish confirmations.

During Lent, from March 16-April 13, the cross will be available to parishes who wish to use it as a part of Lenten devotions. The Office of Liturgy has prepared a prayer service, which can be used in conjunction with other parish celebrations.
