jewelry to be melted down. Others gave precious stones, and some offered their time to help with construction.


Moses was overwhelmed. "We, have more than enough now! Tomorrow we will begin and work every day but the Sabbath."

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
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
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According to witnesses, a huge cloud came down from the sky as the Ark was put in the Most Holy Place. The cloud filled the entire building. King Solomon said, "To-

day I have provided a fitting place for the Ark, which symbolizes the covenant that God made with our ancestors when he brought them out of Egypt to the Promised Land.





