RCOA speaker to focus on health care for the elderly

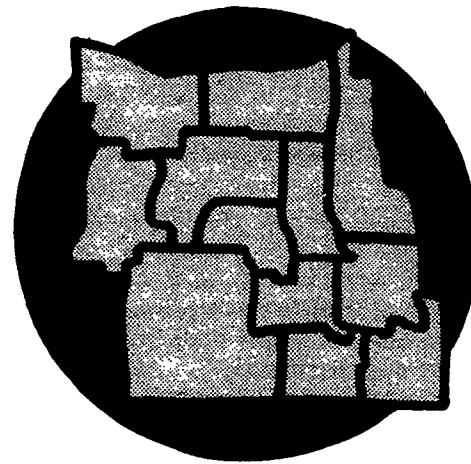
