Trying to keep up with the big kids was no easy task for 2-year-old Maggie Buttino during the 10th Annual 'Dance For Love' held Feb. 28-29 at St. John Fisher College, 3690 East Ave., Rochester. Maggie's father, Lou Buttino, has organized the 24-hour dance marathon for the past 10 years. The Fisher journalism professor will turn the project over next year so that he can spend more time with his family. The record-breaking \$75,000 that was raised will be donated to the Teddi Project of Camp Good Days and Special Times, which provides last wishes to terminally ill children. The Freedom Forum (formerly The Gannett Foundation) provided a \$5,000 grant in Buttino's name. St. John Fisher students have raised more than \$300,000 during the 10-year marathon.
