Jerusalem — The Sanhedrin, governing council of the Hebrews, met today to determine if enough evidence existed to bring formal charges against Jesus of Nazareth.

The star witness at the hearing was a man who reported that when Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead, "Jesus promised that anyone who believes in him would experience the same type of resurrection."

Sanhedrin members also heard statements from a woman who said that Jesus had forgiven her sins. Since only God has such power, such a claim would be blasphemous, several members declared.

Other witnesses testified that Jesus had cured them of blindness, deafness, paralysis and demonic possession.

Following the hearing, Caiaphas, the high priest, was asked if Jesus would be formally charged.

Caiaphas said that a final decision had not been made, adding, however, "Better for one man to die than for our entire nation to be destroyed."


