

tor, Father Raymond Wahl.

The dinner in the parish center is part of a yearlong celebration marking the parish's 35th anniversary.

The committee organizing the event is hoping that former parochial vicars, schoolteachers and parishioners will join current parish members for the gala honoring Father Wahl, who foun-

ded the parish in 1956. He served as the Auburn church's pastor until he retired in 1982.

Bishop James Kearney appointed Father Wahl as pastor of Sacred Heart on Oct. 2, 1956. In addition to overseeing the construction of the first church (now the parish center) and the new church, he spurred efforts to build the school, rectory and convent buildings.

Other anniversary events will include a picnic, tentatively scheduled for Aug. 15, following the 5:15 p.m. Mass; and a dinner dance at the Springside Inn, on Friday, Oct. 30.

Former abortionist slated to address rescue 'revival'

Carol Everett, who formerly operated an abortion clinic before becoming a pro-life advocate, is scheduled to be the keynote speaker at a prayer and intercession rally next week in Orchard Park, N.Y.

The April 15 rally will begin at 7 p.m. at the Full Gospel Tabernacle, 3210 Southwestern Blvd., in Orchard Park, a Buffalo suburb.

Everett, the author of The Scarlet Lady: Confessions of a Successful Abortionist, claims that she was responsible for 35,000 deaths by abortion, including maternal deaths. She also acknowledged that she herself had an abortion.
