ROCHESTER — Mike McGwin, who graduated from the former Cardinal Mooney High School, led the Nazareth College men's basketball team in several categories this season.

McGwin, a 6-foot-10 junior center, was the Golden Flyers' leading scorer (13.8 points per game), rebounder (6.6 per game) and shot blocker (53 for the year). In addition, he set a school record for field-goal percentage in a season (63.1).

**McQ going for it all**

Mike Fennell, McQuaid Jesuit's first-year head coach, undoubtedly wants his players reaching for the brass ring.

"We're shooting for the City-Catholic League and sectional titles," stated Fennell. "There's no other reason to play if you don't have high expectations."

Fennell's background reflects the success he's striving for at McQuaid: he caught at LeMoyne University for future major league pitchers Tom Browning and Jim DeShaies; Fennell himself played for five years in the New York Yankees farm system and rose as high as Class AA.

The Knights, who did well in City-Catholic competition last year but only went 11-12 overall, are looking to improve behind a wealth of pitching talent. Those hurlers include seniors Christian Klein, Dave Skvorak and Mark Birkett; juniors Matt Glavin, Jim Malvaso and Brian Cannon; and sophomores Pat Derleth and Matt Barbato.

Derleth and senior Mark Scott share catching duties, and first base is split by Barbato and Birkett.

The infield has junior Mike Roselli at second base, senior Jim Pashalidis at shortstop, senior Pat Colacino at third base, junior Kelly Scanlon at third and short, and junior Koi Jackson at short and second.

Outfielders are Klein and Glavin, senior Chris Davis, and juniors Tom Brewer and Don Pecor.

**ND's arms hold the key**

Elmira Notre Dame is well equipped to handle the potentially heavy load of rescheduled games. Like McQuaid, ND Coach John Cain plans on using eight hurlers this season.

Leading the mound patrol are seniors Bryan Woodworth, Tony Mustaco and Chris O'Herron. Other pitchers include juniors Shaun Bennett, John Violette, Will Cain (the coach's son) and Mike Cornacchio; and sophomore Dan Wilson.

"I'm kind of encouraged because we seem to have more pitching this year," Coach Cain commented.

Coach Cain, whose club won the Section 4 Class C title two years ago, is

looking forward to the Crusaders' challenging league schedule. ND went 5-7 in the Sullivan Trail Conference a year ago.

"Our record might not reflect how good we are," said Cain, who is beginning his seventh year as head coach. "But by the time we get to sectionals, I think we'll be able to compete pretty well. I have high hopes."
