## Boycott would only harm the needy

To the editors:

On March 26, 1992, you carried an article entitled, "Abortion clinic opponents target United Way." There are other issues that must be considered. Your article stated that "agencies are going to be hurt." Agencies are not really the issue; the *people* of our community are going to be hurt by the proposed opposition to the United Way. United Way services are not just charitable handouts but services which strengthen and support families.

In this past year, Catholic Family Center provided services to over 39,000 individuals, many of those services supported through United Way funding. Catholic Family Center receives the largest allocation of United Way funds in our community. These services include:

- Inner City Counseling and support for families struggling with poverty.
- Pregnancy Counseling and Prevention services for high risk teens.
- Catholic Youth Organization training, tutoring and employment services for disadvantaged youth.
- Counseling for families in high stress.
- Adoption placement and family support services ... *The only United Way supported adoption service in the community.*

Thousands of individuals and families, in the greater Rochester area, count on United Way's fiscal support to these and other essential community programs. Bishop Clark has said, "Opposing the United Way will not stop the opening of (an abortion) clinic but

will jeopardize the funding of a host of county services to the poor, the disabled, the needy and many others as well."

The target of opposition to the abortion clinic should not be the United Way but the abortion clinic. We must ask "Will this clinic be stopped by opposition to the United Way or will we only limit our community services for our neighbors in need?"

We encourage your readers to remember the pro-family services of the Catholic Family Center, and other agencies, and weigh the greater good when they make their United Way contribution.
