JERUSALEM, 33 A.D. - Roman guards have reported missing a corpse that had been placed in a tomb owned by Joseph of Arimathea. The missing body is that of Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified and died last Friday. Jesus was executed after being convicted of attempting to overthrow the government.

The guards who reported the missing body had been posted at the tomb site by Pontius Pilate at the request of Hebrew chief priests. Before Jesus' death, some of his followers claimed that he would rise from the dead. after three days, and the priests feared that these followers would steal the body to prove their claims.

The guards admitted to their commanding officer that they had fallen asleep while on duty. When they awakened, they realized the corpse was missing.

Unconfirmed reports indicated that an earthquake took place near the tomb early Sunday morning.

Charges have surfaced that the two guards may have taken bribes to report the body stolen. New rumors claim that Jesus of Nazareth has been seen alive in Jerusalem.


