"You both seem very upset," the man said. "Sometimes it helps to talk about your troubles."


"We've lost someone who was very close to us," I began. "And it never should have happened."


meal, Jesus took bread and wine and blessed it. Before he passed it to each of us to share, he said the oddest thing: 'When you do this again, do it in memory of me."

Two of the dead man's followers said they spoke with Jesus on a road between Jerusalem and Emmaus. They also claimed that he had come to their house for dinner.


