THESE BILLIONS COULD:

- 1) Improve the quality of life for all welfare people.
- 2) Let fathers and mothers each earn a set amount—(similar to FICA limits), plus their welfare benefits.
- 3) Increase dramatically, discretionary income to those in the inner city that need it most.

Discretionary income can become the force to:

- * purchase items in one's own neighborhood in much larger numbers
- * develop a much larger and stronger inner-city business establishment
- * establish a much larger and stronger inner-city middle class
- * fix and repair apartments and houses in which they live
- * lead to the eventual purchase of property of homes and businesses in the inner-city
- * require a better delivery and reception of knowledge in area schools
