



**Sr. Charity Gocshar celebrates 50 years**

Sister Charity Gocshar, OLC, a Rochester native and former parishioner of Holy Apostles Church, is celebrating her 50th anniversary in the Sisters of Charity this year.

Currently the superior of the sisters' Gannondale community in Erie, Pa., Sister Gocshar had served as regional and assistant superior in Rochester and Erie. She is also a member of the Council of North American Union of the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity.

Born in Rochester on April 21, 1918, Sister Gocshar is the daughter of the late Charles and Lillian Gocshar. She attended Holy Apostles Grammar School, Nazareth Academy and Rochester Business Institute, all in Rochester. She entered the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity on Feb. 1, 1942, and made her final vows on July 31, 1947.

Sister Gocshar taught at Rochester's Holy Angels Home, a residential center for wayward teenage girls, from 1942-51. She then served as the home's director from 1951-75.

A graduate of State University of New York Empire State College with a degree in social welfare, Sister Gocshar arrived at Gannondale Residential Center in June, 1986.

ROCHESTER — Arun Gandhi, the grandson of Mahatma Gandhi, is scheduled to speak about "Violence, Children and the Future" at 7:30 p.m. July 2. The speech will take place at Aeon Baptist Church, 175 Genesee St.

Director of the the M.K. Gandhi Institute for Nonviolence in Memphis, Tenn., Gandhi has worked in South Africa and India to help break the cycle of poverty and violence.

His talk will be preceded by a one-mile Neighborhood Walk for Peace, set to begin at 6:45 p.m. at the church.

Both Gandhi's talk and the walk are being organized by the Alternatives to Violence Institute, a project run by the Center for Dispute Settlement, 242 Andrews St. As part of his July 2 visit, Gandhi will also meet with co-trainers from the institute and with peer mediators from local middle and high schools at 10:30 a.m.
