PITTSFORD - In addition to causing huge traffic problems on Jefferson Road, the Rochester International can turn lives upside down with its time constraints.

Not to the point, however, where all Ladies Professional Golf Association players, volunteer workers and spectators put their faith on hold.

Close to 150 people crowded into the tiny Carmelite Monastery chapel last Saturday, June 27, to attend a 5:30 p.m. Mass following the conclusion of thirdround play at Locust Hill Country Club. The monastery is located at 1931 Jefferson Road, right next to the site of Rochester's biggest sporting event of the year.
