

CUA head thanks bishop for diocesan contributions

ROCHESTER — In a recent letter to Bishop Matthew H. Clark, Father William J. Byron, SJ, president of Catholic University of America, thanked the Diocese of Rochester for its contribution of \$26,268.42 to its annual diocesan collection.

"My responsibilities here at CUA would have been unmanageable without the prayers, encouragement and financial support from dioceses like yours across the country," Father Byron wrote. "You and your people are partners with me in this enterprise."

The Washington, D.C. university is the nation's only higher-education institution established by United States bishops. Founded in 1887, it is also the only American university with ecclesiastical faculties granting canonical degrees in theology, philosophy and canon law.

The following articles are available: school desks; carnival and fair booths and supplies; pre-school furniture and supplies; and tabernacle, altar, pews and supplies for a small chapel.


