

### Class reunion scheduled

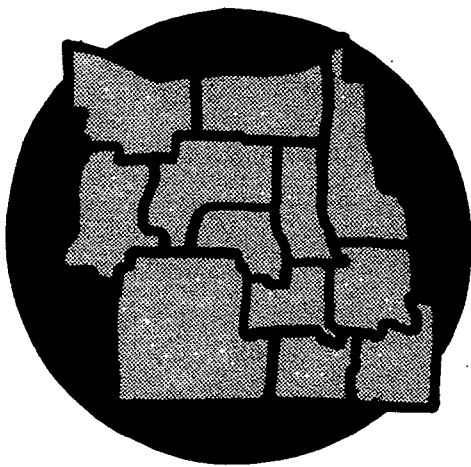
