Don't waste time on twisted thriller, silly spoof

NEW YORK — Whispers in the Dark (Paramount) turns the disturbed sexual fantasies of the psychiatrist's couch into fodder for a tawdry potboiler about sexual violence against women.


The dopey plot has a naive psychiatrist (Annabella Sciorra) beginning an affair with a pilot (Jamey Sheridan) then discovering he is the sadist her sexually voracious patient (Deborah Unger) has been describing.

When the shrink finds the patient hanging nude in her gallery, she discovers both their mutual lover and another of her violent patients (John Leguizamo) are prime suspects. Terrified of both men, she turns to her mentor (Alan Alda) for help, but this proves fatal for several around her.

Writer and director Christopher Crowe exploits the theme of women being ravaged, tortured and murdered in a lurid melodrama riddled with absurd coincidences.

With the emphasis on women as victims and no logic to the sick behavior of the men, it is more dehumanizing schlock than nifty thriller.

Scenes of nudity, masturbation and mutilation are entirely unnecessary to the mechanics of the plot and make the movie especially repugnant. Whispers in the Dark is something to shout

about: it's trash.

Because of recurring violence and nudity, graphic photos of tortured women, sexually explicit dialogue and situations and much rough language, the U.S. Catholic Conference classification is O - morally offensive. The Motion Picture Association of America rating is R.

save the world, but this movie is another matter.

Saddled with a witless script and Greg Beeman's heavy-handed direction, Teri Garr and Jeffrey Jones haplessly star as a suburban mom and dad kidnaped to a planet of idiots lorded over by a dictator (Jon Lovitz) bent on marrying mom and blowing the Earth to smithereens.

Mom and Dad (Warner Bros.) is about as funny as it sounds. Lovitz, currently winning audiences in A League of Their Own, here has a losing role as the foolish, foppish tyrant, inexplicably stuck on the ditzy housewife.

One oasis amid the wasteland of dull dialogue is production design combining a perky panorama of colorful visuals straight out of the "Flash Gordon" era. As a spoof on suburbia and science fiction, however, this flick never gets off the ground.

Due to a few off-color references, the USCC classification is A-II — adults and adolescents. The MPAA rating is PG — parental guidance suggested.
