Film builds dramatic case against Ivy League bigotry

Jewish student hides his identity

NEW YORK (CNS) — Building a quietly dramatic case for the ground-lessness of prejudice, School Ties (Paramount) tells of the trials and tribulations of a Jewish student in a posh New England prep school in the 1950s.

A football scholarship allows David Greene (Brendan Fraser) to spend his senior year at St. Matthew's Academy, a universe away from his working class upbringing in Scranton, Pa.

A sweet guy who is accepted by his wealthy WASP fellow students since he restores their football glory, David hides the fact he is Jewish when he hears their anti-Semitic remarks.

His newfound friendships and a budding romance abruptly end when a jealous dorm-mate (Matt Damon) angrily reveals David's religion. The ugly bigotry escalates when a teacher discovers someone has cheated on a final exam.

Director Robert Mandel's modest film builds dramatically and resonates with honesty well after the credits finish rolling.

The dialogue pulls no punches in exposing usually unspoken prejudices that can be passed on through genera-

tions and tacitly accepted.

Central to the movie's strength are the fleshed-out characterizations. David is not a martyr — he too is seen as culpable for having denied his heritage. Nor are his classmates and girlfriend (Amy Locane) given simplistic treatment as despicable bigots. Instead, they are shown as flawed youngsters, but capable of rethinking their views. Only the headmaster and chaplain are sketchily written.

Beyond the hard-hitting message, the movie is an excellent drama. Never trite or predictable, the situations develop solidly and credibly to a satisfying conclusion. In addition, the production design is handsome, finely evoking the closed exclusivity of the privileged private academy in the '50s.

Another minor feat is the film's ability to sympathetically convey the overwhelming pressure the wealthy boys feel to make it into an Ivy League college and not break generations of family traditions.

Both Fraser and Damon bring skill and shading to their performances, which makes the movie's small surprises have extra impact.

School Ties ought to strike a meaningful chord with young and old alike.

Due to minor fisticuffs, a few sexual references and brief rear nudity, the U.S. Catholic Conference classification is A-II — adults and adolescents. The Motion Picture Association of America rating is PG-13 — parents are strongly cautioned that some material may be inappropriate for children under 13.
