Muddled 'Mohicans' never really quite meshes

NEW YORK — The characters and some of the key action scenes are all that remain in the latest screen version of James Fenimore Cooper's classic novel *The Last of the Mohicans* (Twentieth'Century Fox).

The movie starts in 1757, the third year of the French and Indian War, and New York's colonial militia is away defending the frontier with the British troops at Fort William.

Pausing to help while on their way to Kan-Tuck-Key are a veteran trio of the forest — Hawkeye (Daniel Day-Lewis), his Mohican foster father, Chingachgook (Russell Means), and the Mohican's son, the noble Uncas (Eric Schweig) of the title.

After surrendering the besieged Fort William to the French, the British forces are allowed to leave under safe conduct.

The Huron allies of the French, however, ambush the British as they march through the wilderness.

Though Hawkeye is unable to stop the resulting massacre, he at least is able to rescue the British commander's daughter, Cora (Madeleine Stowe), whom he loves.

Central to all this is the treachery of the wicked Huron warrior, Magua (Wes Studi), who ultimately kills Uncas and in turn is hacked to pieces by Chingachgook.

In adapting Cooper's classic to the screen, director Michael Mann updates its romanticized version of pioneer life

amidst noble woodland savages by dwelling in realistic detail on the savagery of hand-to-hand combat.

adventure, The Last of the Mohicans.

Mann's Hawkeye, unlike Cooper's superhero, is an angry young man who slashes his way through the wilderness while pining passionately for Cora, who returns his love for no apparent reason.

The result is a confusing mixture of romantic idealism and violent realism that never meshes in any way but does

provide some silly bemusement.

One can admire the respect the production pays to the Indians' closeness to nature, but the humanity of the characters is missing from the truncated, unsatisfying narrative.

Because of its many graphic depictions of deadly violence and bloodshed, the U.S. Catholic Conference classification is A-III — adults. The Motion Picture Association of America rating is R — restricted.

Writer-director Cameron Crowe taps into the anxieties of the twentysomething crowd with his romantic comedy Singles (Warner Bros.).

The subject is the dating game as practiced by the residents of a singles apartment complex in Seattle.

Janet (Bridget Fonda) is dating rocker Cliff (Matt Dillon) and doesn't want to hear that she's not his main or only squeeze.

Downstairs, Steve (Campbell Scott) has sworn off women for work, until he sees Linda (Kyra Sedgwick) at a rock club. Both are wary of a new relationship but unable to take it slowly.

Debbie (Sheila Kelley) is going the video dating route with a strange tape sure to attract the local looneys.

Crowe keeps it mostly light-hearted and superficial as the young adults triumph or get wounded in the dating

The only dramatic element is Steve and Linda's break-up when she thinks he only proposed because she was pregnant.

With its upbeat tone and clever dialogue, Singles appears it will have a steady date at the box office.

Because of a restrained treatment of a sexual encounter, a benign attitude toward premarital affairs and an instance of rough language, the USCC classification is A-III — adults. The MPAA rating is PG-13 — parents are strongly cautioned that some material may be inappropriate for children under 13.
