Cayuga cluster joins list of groups studying aging

WEEDSPORT — The Northern Cayuga Cluster's Social Ministry Committee saw a need, and Mercy Center with the Aging is helping to fill

Last week the Mercy Center began presenting its six-part Family Education Series on Aging at. St. Joseph's Church Hall in Weedsport for the cluster, which includes St. Joseph's, St. John's in Port Byron and St. Patrick's in Cato.

Mary Degnan, the chairwoman of the social ministry committee, said her group felt the series was needed to respond to the increasing numbers of older people in the cluster.

"Never before has the population been aging so fast," Degnan observed. "We need education just to know what's coming and how to help peo-

Degnan said she became aware of the need for education while she was making Communion calls.

"People were asking. Where do you go to get services?" and I didn't know," she reported. "Needs are not being met. People don't know where to go.'

But educating the elderly is not the only reason the cluster community decided to host the series, noted Father Ronald Frederick, the cluster's parochial vicar.

"It's also for the younger generation who have to cope with parents who are getting up in age," the priest observed.

Providing information for individuals of all ages is indeed one of the goals of the center's education series, acknowledged Sister Gratia L'Esperance, RSM, assistant director of Mercy Center With the Aging.

"We have all ages coming," Sister L'Esperance said.

She reported that more couples and more young people are coming to the center's sessions, not only out of concern for their own futures, but also because increasing life spans mean many couples of middle age and younger are struggling to care for elderly parents.

The center has presented the education series at 82 different churches and agencies since 1984, Sister L'Esperance reported. In addition to the sessions at St. Joseph's, the Family Education Series is also taking place this fall at St. John the Evangelist Church on Ridge Road. The Greece

parish is presenting the series in in conjunction with Greece Baptist Church.

The series covers such topics as: the effects of aging; caring for elderly relatives; hospital and nursing-home care; home care; improved communication skills; legal planning; and making health-care decisions.

Although the education series is eight-years-old, Mercy Center staff keeps updating to make it relevant, Sister L'Esperance observed. For example, the health-care system - and the rising cost of health care — is especially worrisome to people today.

"I think people are very aware of and very worried about the health care system," Sister L'Esperance said. "People have a fear of losing their health insurance."

Further, the series helps to fight negative attitudes about aging, Sister L'Esperance said. She noted that these attitudes can be easily seen by looking


at the selection of birthday cards offered in any store.

When the education series concludes in a parish, parish leaders frequently decide to create programs or expand services they already offer, Sister L'Esperance reported. Each parish or group of churches, she added, "is as unique as each individual."

Degnan pointed out, for example, that the Northern Cayuga Cluster is in a largely rural area. Thus the elderly population faces some problems that seniors in urban areas might not face. Those problems include distance from available services — and from other

people.
"Somebody could die out here and we wouldn't know for a week," Degnan said. "We need to know the people and the services available."

Father Frederick said one of the cluster's hopes for the Family Education Series on Aging "is for a ministry to come out of this to care for the needs of the elderly."
