

Adoption expert to speak at conference in Penfield

PENFIELD — Well-known family counselor Holly van Gulden will be the keynote speaker for a "Perspectives on Adoption" conference, which will take place Saturday, Nov. 7, at Bay Trail Middle School.

The daylong conference will feature more than 40 presenters and workshops covering such topics as infertility, open-adoption contracts, agency requirements, post-adoption issues, cultural sensitivity and searches. An adult adoptee panel will discuss their experiences growing up.

Three talks will be given by van Gulden at the conference. Her topics will be "Bonding & Attachment," "The Value of Humor" and "Successful Adoptive Parenting." She will also

conduct three "how-to" workshops during the day.

In addition to helping parents after experiencing the adoption process, the conference is designed to help pre-adoptive couples and singles sift through adoption information. Information will be available about domestic, international, and interracial adoption.

Campaign for Human Development grants available

ROCHESTER — Applications for the 1993 Campaign for Human Development national grants are available from the Diocese of Rochester.

Projects must fall under certain CHD guidelines and be run by groups with at least 50 percent involuntarily, low-income representation.

Grant requests are normally in excess of \$10,000; the average national grant size is \$28,800.

All groups interested in applying for the campaign are required to submit a pre-application by Nov. 2. Projects that meet the minimum criteria and guidelines will be encouraged to submit a full application by Jan. 30, 1993.

The Campaign for Human Development was established in 1970 by the United States Catholic bishops as an education-action program to combat domestic poverty. Each year a collection is taken up in Catholic churches throughout the country for this purpose. A total of \$7 million was distributed to 205 community-based projects in the last funding cycle.
