## **Bishop announces Respect Life grants**

ROCHESTER — Bishop Matthew H. Clark announced Monday, Nov. 2, that 15 pro-life organizations in the Rochester diocese will share \$17,400 in Respect Life Fund grants.

The fund is supported by the Thanks Giving Appeal, the Rochester diocese's

chief source of income.

The Respect Life fund was established in 1983 to support organizations in the 12-county diocese offering services, pastoral counseling and alternatives to abortion for women facing problem pregnancies.
