## Appeal aids urban parishes

**ROCHESTER** — Corpus Christi Parish uses the funds to teach parenting skills to pregnant teenagers, and to help ex-prisoners make the transition back into society.

The Roman Catholic Community of the 19th Ward trains adults to evangelize with the funding it receives.

St. George's Lithunanian Church finances Lithuanian language and dance classes for its Youth/Young Adult program.


All the money for these diversified programs — the sum is \$122,700 comes from the diocesan Department of Urban Services' Urban Subsidy Program. The diocesan department depends entirely on Thanks Giving Appeal monies to help provide funding for the programs, according to Kathleen Cannon, director of Urban Services.

Cannon noted that many diocesan Catholics may not realize how vital their TGA contributions are to their own parishes and those around them.

"A large percentage of the money goes to subsidize salary positions at the parish level," she said.

Indeed, St. Augustine, St. Francis of Assisi, Ss. Peter and Paul, Holy Family, St. Anthony of Padua, Holy Redeemer-St. Francis Xavier, St. Michael and St. Philip Neri churches all depend on TGA funding to employ various staff people.

In addition, TGA funding for the Urban Subsidy Program enables Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, and St. Francis of Ass-



isi parishes to hire Spanish-speaking pastoral associates.

But the diocesan Department of Urban Services does more than help parishes pay their employees. In addition to providing subsidies, the diocesan office oversees many programs - including the offices of Black Ministries, Asian Pacific Ministries, and the Spanish Apostolate.

Diocesan Catholics come in contact with these ministries in a number of ways, such as:

 Monthly Masses for the diocese's Vietnamese population.

• Language tutoring programs for adults.

• Black history celebrations.

Ministry programs for Native Americans and migrant workers.

 Leadership training for lay Hispanic Catholic ministers.

• Diocesan youth, family, adult and elderly retreats, emphasizing the focus group's culture, concerns and language.
