speed," said LaPietra. "But I don't want to use that as an excuse, because the field was the same for both of us.

"We put some pressure on them, but I thought we may have tried to pass too much," LaPietra added.

Despite AQ's offensive handicaps, the defense managed to keep ES-M scoreless through 80 minutes of regulation play.

However, the Spartans' Keith Casey dribbled to the top of the AQ penalty area and dished off to teammate Tim Alexander, who fired a shot from 12 yards away that eluded Irish goalie Josh Gleason just 2:19 into suddendeath overtime.

Aquinas was ranked No. 1 in the state heading into the game before be-

ing dealt its first shutout loss of the year. ES-M had also defeated another former No. 1 team, Chittenango, in the Section 3 Class B championships. The Spartans were finally stopped by Wantagh of Section 8 (Nassau County), 3-1, in the state finals held one day after their win over Aquinas.

And so ends the best year ever for AQ boys' soccer. After an overtime loss to McQuaid in the season's fifth game, AQ bounced back to capture all of its remaining regular-season games — and nose out the Knights for the City-Catholic League championship in the process — before making its memorable post-season run.

"We had a great time. The kids may not experience anything like that in their lives again," LaPietra concluded.


