

## Arthur Patrick Farren, of Canandaigua, at 80

CANANDAIGUA — Arthur Patrick Farren, who was among the founders of the St. Joseph's House of Hospitality 52 years ago, died on Sunday, Feb. 7, 1993, at his home on West Lake Road. He was 80 years old.

Formerly of Rochester, Mr. Farren graduated from the Aquinas Institute of Rochester. In addition to helping found the Catholic worker house in Rochester, he served as a labor union representative and worked for several years in various editorial positions at the *Catholic Courier*.

Mr. Farren also was active in fundraising activities for parishes and organizations in the Rochester diocese. In 1983, he and his family moved to Canandaigua, where Mr. Farren became active at St. Mary's Parish, 95 N. Main St., and the Notre Dame Retreat House, 5151 Foster Road.

In addition to serving as a 4th degree member of the Knights of Columbus, Mr. Farren was a member of the Knights of Equity, an Irish organization. He was also active in the Finger Lakes House of Hope.

The family will receive friends at their home at 4443 West Lake Road, on Feb. 11, from 7-9 p.m. and Feb. 12, from 2-4 p.m. and 7-9 p.m.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be held at St. Mary's Church on Saturday, Feb. 13, at 10 a.m. Interment will be in Calvary Cemetery. In lieu of flowers, memorial contributions may be made in Mr. Farren's memory to the Family

Mr. Farren is survived by his wife, Mary (Bigham) Farren; his son, Patrick G. and daughter-in-law, Glenda Alderman, of Watertown, Mass.; three daughters, Mary Anne Will, of Rockland, Maine; Margaret, of Stoddard, N.H.; and Christine, of Middlesex, Vt.; five grandchildren, Jesse, Caitlin and Gabriel Farren, Paul and Lawrence Will; and a sister-in-law, Margaret (Bigham) Driscoll, of Newfield, N.Y.

## Sr. E. Marchner; Webster native

Sister Ellen Marchner, a missionary nun and native of Webster, died at the Convent of the Holy Spirit in Techny, Ill., on Nov. 28, 1992. She was 89.

Sister Ellen joined the Holy Spirit Missionary Sisters in 1921 and professed her missionary vows in 1924. After receiving her bachelor of science degree at DePaul University, she performed her graduate work at Loyola University of Chicago.

Sister Ellen was appointed as a missionary in the Far East beginning in 1935. She spent seven months in a Japanese concentration camp during World War II, and did not return to the United States until 1949.

Sister Ellen returned to the Far East in 1964, when she became a professor

## Fr. John Lowe; McQuaid teacher

Father John F. Lowe, SJ, a former teacher and private counselor in the Rochester area, died on Dec. 14, 1992, at Genesee Hospital. He was 66.

A native of Manhattan, Father Lowe entered the Jesuits in 1943. He was ordained in 1956.

Father Lowe taught at Brooklyn Prep and McQuaid Jesuit High School until 1967, when he began service as a chaplain in the U.S. Army. He logged a one-year tour of Vietnam.

Following his Army service, Father Lowe studied social work at Boston College and became licensed as a psychotherapist in 1973.

That same year he returned to Rochester and was a member of the McQuaid Jesuit community while he conducted a private psychotherapy practice.

A Mass of Christ the High Priest for Father Lowe was held in the McQuaid Jesuit chapel on Dec. 16. Burial was in the Jesuit cemetery at Auriesville, N.Y.

Father Lowe is survived by a brother, Edward, and a sister, Marie.

Among her places of employment over the years were Aquinas Institute, Sacred Heart Academy and St. John Fisher College. She also served for more

than 30 years as a volunteer at St. Mary's Hospital.

Mrs. Updaw's cousin, Father Peter Bayer, celebrated her Mass of Christian Burial on Dec. 11 at our Lady of Lourdes Church. Interment was at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

She is survived by her husband, Raymond F. Updaw; father, Gerard Bayer; brother and sister-in-law, Robert and Peggy Bayer; niece and nephew, Eileen and Douglas Bayer.

## Sister D. Lyons; former teacher

Sister Dorothy Lyons, SSND, a former instructor at Ss. Peter and Paul School in Rochester, died on Saturday, Jan. 9, 1993, at Lourdes Health Care Center in Wilton, Conn. She was 87.

The former S. Mary Cletus, a native of Malden, Mass., was professed as a School Sister of Notre Dame in 1929. Sister Lyons served for more than four decades as a Catholic elementary school classroom and music instructor.

During the 1960-61 school year, she taught at Ss. Peter and Paul.

A Mass of the Resurrection was held for Sister Lyons on Jan. 13, 1993, at the School Sisters of Notre Dame motherhouse in Wilton. Interment was at St. Mary's Cemetery in Bethel, Conn.
