Monarchs rule in track invitational

Despite placing first in only two events, Our Lady of Mercy earned the team title over 27 other girls' track squads at the Larry Fabian Memorial Relays. The meet was held this past Saturday, April 23, at SUNY College at Geneseo.

The Monarchs' consistency made the difference as they finished with 65 points, seven points better than second-place Greece Athena. Mercy won the 3,200-yard relay and distancemedley relay, and also turned in topfour finishes in eight of the remaining 10 events.


