
# Parish exemplifies joy in the Lord

Sunday morning broke bright and beautiful in western New York. The sun shone, the earth was fresh and green, and all was quiet as I made the early morning drive to Honeoye to celebrate with the community of St. Mary's and participate in the blessing of their new parish center. I saw more deer than cars as I made my way south and enjoyed the opportunity to reflect on the achievement of the parish and on the many benefits their new center would bring to the community.

By the time I arrived I was quite anxious to see the new addition. It is even more impressive than I thought it would be, and it became clear immediately that the parish community is proud and happy that they can now enjoy such an important resource.
