**Pastor resigns after allegation of misconduct**

SPENCERPORT — Father Robert J. Winterkorn resigned the pastorate of St. John the Evangelist Church on Sept. 22, after allegations of sexual misconduct were made by a female parishioner.

According to a diocesan statement, Bishop Matthew H. Clark requested the pastor's resignation after Father Winterkorn admitted to the allegations. He is currently on administrative leave.

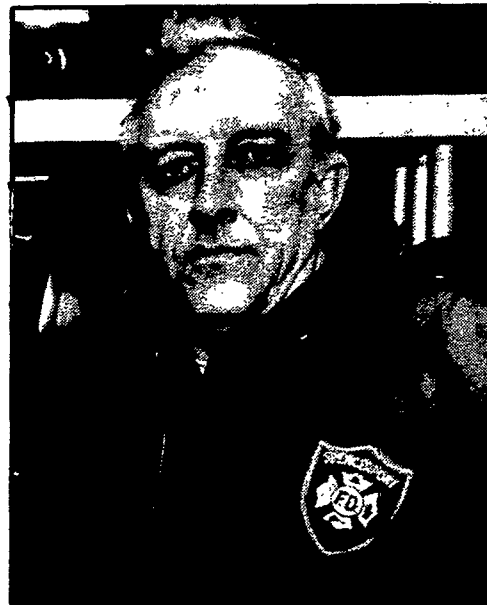
Father Robert P. Ring, director of the diocesan department of priests' personnel, noted that the allegations stem from "a situation involving a person that began 10 years ago." He reported that the woman contacted the diocese to report the allegations.

Father Ring added that he hoped Father Winterkorn's parishioners would understand that the situation was much like that of any "victim" of abuse by a psychiatrist or other individual working as a professional counselor.

"It's professional misconduct within the priest/parishioner relationship," he said.

The woman did not want to press criminal charges or pursue a civil settlement, Father Ring explained.

"Father Winterkorn will be away from the diocese for a period of time for assessment and treatment," the statement said. "When that is completed, his future in ministry will be

determined." In accordance with diocesan policy, the priest "is not permitted to celebrate the sacraments publicly," the statement concluded.

A temporary administrator for the parish will be appointed by the end of this week, Father Ring said. He added that a new pastor may be named within the next two months, and that he would be in place by Jan. 1, 1994.
