

A Message From the Director

In his missionary encyclicat, "The Mission of the Redeemer," Pope John Paul II reminds us of the "immense portion" of the human family that does "not know Christ": millions upon millions of men, women and children.

Think a moment who they may be: a frightened mother in Somalia, a work-worn father in a Bangladeshi village, an abandoned child on the streets of Nairobi, Kenya.

What difference would "knowing Christ" make to them?



- In Shillong-Gauhati, India, Sister-novices need support as they prepare for a lifetime of bringing the "Good News" from village to village.
- In Flores, Indonesia, seminarians need help in their preparation for the priesthood.

Sister Mary Ann MacRae, Medical Missionary of Mary, Abakaliki, Nigeria is a doctor in charge of a hospital that does extensive work in the field of leprosy and TB control; the hospital also has a busy maternity unit. Sister Mary Ann says her people teach her "something about joy...about acceptance of suffering...about hospitality...about generosity."

Today there are some 5,440 U.S. missionaries -Religious priests, Sisters, Brothers, diocesan priests and lay
men and women -- serving overseas, living their faith, sharing their faith, strengthened in their faith by the people they
serve. On World Mission Sunday, we pray for them and for

respond to Christ's call to this special vocation of "missionary to the nations."
