sure finally proved decisive in overtime as Liz Villamil scored with 1:08 remaining in the first 10-minute OT. The Plainsmen's Brooke Bartlett added an insurance goal with 2:49 left in the second extra period.

The match saw an end to an incredible scoring streak by Montesano, who was held without at least one goal in a game for the first time in 22 contests this season. She finished the year with a school-record 41 goals.

"They kept yelling, 'two on (uniform number) 2, two on 2,'" said Montesano of Shenendehowa's successful double-teaming efforts.

The Plainsmen had also eliminated the Monarchs from the state semifinals in 1991 with a 1-0 shootout victory.

All in all, however, it was a memorable year for a Mercy club that added a second Section 5 Class A championship to its inaugural 1991 title. The Monarchs won 3-1 over Greece Athena in the sectional finals on Nov. 6, and added a 6-0 rout of Orchard Park in the Western Region title game on Nov. 13. Their final 1993 record was 17-5.

"We accomplished our main goal, and that was to win sectionals. You can never take that patch away from us," Montesano remarked.

"We hit our peak at the right time, I think," said Boughton. "And this team stands out because these were people who weren't counted on to win anything. It's probably the closest team I've ever had."

## McQuaid's Reitz dominates in Jesuit Championships

Because McQuaid Jesuit teammate Dan Lesser has enjoyed such a standout season, teammate Adam Reitz's own significant accomplishments have often been overlooked this season.

Reitz, however, captured the spotlight in the Jesuit Schools Championships held this past Saturday, Nov. 20, at Van Cortlandt Park in New York City. The senior took first place with a time of 13 minutes, 15 seconds over the 2.5-mile course.

Reitz bested a field of 70 runners representing 10 Jesuit high schools from the northeastern United States. He won by a full 27 seconds over the next-closest finisher, Ryan Sheehan of St. Joseph's in Philadelphia.

The senior was coming off a 15th-place finish in the state-

championship race at Stuart Park in Newark the previous Saturday.

Reitz's first place at the Jesuit Championships also helped the Knights capture top honors in team scoring. McQuaid finished with 43 points, while second-place St. Joseph's totaled 49. Rounding out the Knights' top five were Jeff Clark in third place; Mike Perrotta, sixth; Ian Sohn, seventh; and Dan Deckman, 26th.

Two weeks earlier, McQ had earned another prestigious team championship by winning the Section 5 Class A meet for the third consecutive year.

Unfortunately for Lesser, he was unable to compete at the Jesuit meet due to an illness that was discovered earlier last week. He has a mild case of pericarditis — an inflammation of the pericardium sac which surrounds the

heart — and cannot run for at least two weeks. Lesser, a senior, had won individual honors at sectionals and also placed seventh in the states.

Reitz now moves on to the Foot Locker Regional Qualifier race this coming Saturday, Nov. 27, back at Van Cortlandt. The course for this event will be lengthened to 3.1 miles.

Should Reitz place among the top

eight on Saturday, he will automatically become eligible for the Foot Locker Nationals in San Diego, Ca., on Dec. 11.

"He'll be a longshot with only eight spots available, but he's definitely coming on strong," said McQuaid Coach Bob Bradley. "Who knows, maybe he'll pop a big one."
