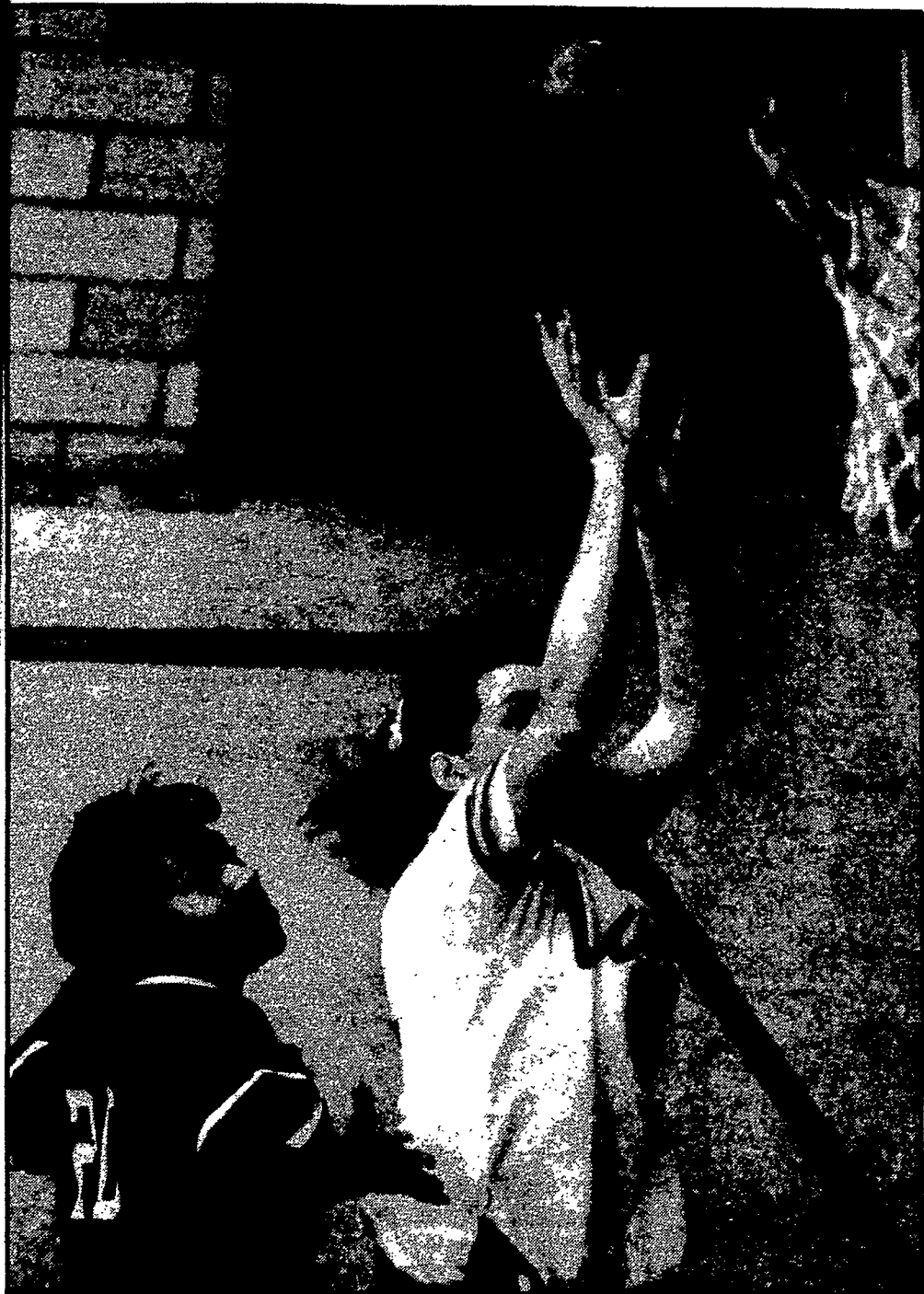

Little Irish defeat Knights in title-game rematch, 5-2

Considering the handicap McQuaid Jesuit started out with, it was to the Knights' credit that they hung in against Aquinas Institute for so long.

The Knights, who have lost to the Little Irish in each of the last two Section 5 Class A finals, were hoping to exact a little revenge when they met AQ this past Saturday, Dec. 4.

But McQuaid, which has prematurely lost its entire first line from 1992-93, went down to a 5-2 defeat at Genesee Valley Ice Arena.

AQ was led by freshman Brian Gionta, who scored three goals. Joe Gionta and Dennis Annechino had the other two Little Irish goals, while Matt Albertsen and Mike Viscardi scored for McQuaid.

The score was tied 0-0 until Brian Gionta scored with 3:02 left in the first period to give Aquinas a lead it never relinquished.

AQ Coach Dave Montgomery thought that McQuaid played well despite the fact that 1992-93 stars Sean Ritchlin and Marty Reasoner are now attending prep school, and linemate Larry Pierce is out with a broken collarbone.

"When you think about Aquinas-McQuaid, it's always a little closer than anyone would have thought," commented Montgomery.

The victory boosted AQ's record to

2-0 in Monroe County League play and 2-2 overall. McQuaid fell to 0-2-1, 0-2-1.


McQuaid managed a 4-4 tie with Rush-Henrietta on Dec. 2 at Lakeshore Rinks, with Tom Savage getting two goals.

AQ was then defeated by Pittsford Mendon, 57-51, in the title contest on Dec. 4.
