## Late free throws lift Kearney to one-point wins

Ed Nietopski has been coaching high-school basketball for nearly 40 years, but he can't recall a turn of events quite like last week's.

His Bishop Kearney boys recorded not one, but a pair of one-point victories on their home court. The Kings rallied for a 33-32 win over rival Aquinas Institute on Dec. 7, and added a 51-50 decision over Wilson on Dec. 10.

"I've had a few (one-point wins), but not back-to-back," remarked Nietopski, whose Kings improved their winning streak to four and their season record to 4-1.

Victory appeared unlikely for BK against Aquinas (1-3). The Kings were trailing 32-30 with :03 to go, and AQ had possession.

But Patrick Goode stole an inbounds pass and set up to take a shot from three-point territory. He was fouled on the play with :02 to go, and was awarded three free throws.

The junior guard sank all three foul shots to give Kearney the improbable win. "We hung right in there. It's a compliment to the boys for not giving up," said Nietopski.

Late free throws also played an important part in BK's win over Wilson three nights later. Senior guard Matt Curran converted both ends of a one-and-one to give his team a 51-47 lead with :21 left, and that four-point cushion proved crucial as Wilson's Leroy Barnes hit a late three-point basket to leave the Wildcats one point short.

## Other sports highlights

The Geneva DeSales girls (4-1) have also put together a four-game winning streak. They won the DeSales Tipoff Tournament, prevailing 66-38 over Lima Christian on Dec. 9 and 31-30 over Romulus on Dec. 11. The Saints rallied from a 25-20 deficit after three quarters against Romulus behind Stephanie Nearpass' 15-point performance.
